Working and fasting doesn't really go together but I can make it through a Friday as the first day of the fast without too many problems and I've increased my ivermectin and mebendazole dosages too since there is so much information out now about how it cures cancer! □ Praying this works! And a side benefit is I've lost another 18 pounds!!!

Since I've been treating the cancer naturally for 3.5 years, I'm investigating getting it cut out but hopefully I can shrink it enough so all I need is a lumpectomy instead of a mastectomy, I'll keep you posted.

Destinations such as the Emerald Coast, San Juan del Sur, and Granada offer exclusive options for high-spending travelers. "Many luxury tourists find in Nicaragua a place where they can enjoy privacy and exclusivity," said Campbell.

Nicaragua reaffirms its commitment to position itself as a unique destination in Central America, attracting both international tourists and investors interested in the development of the tourism sector. The combination of its cultural wealth, natural beauty, and infrastructure projects promises a future for the country's tourism.
